FROM HARDSHIP TO STABILITY

ECONOMIC CONDITIONS
FOR ALICE IN THE TRI-COUNTY
REGION

The **Economic Viability Dashboard** reveals whether the conditions in three key areas – work, housing, and community supports – strengthen or weaken opportunities for households below the ALICE Threshold to reach stability. These families are either in poverty or are **ALICE** (**A**sset **L**imited, **I**ncome **C**onstrained, **E**mployed) – earning above the poverty level but less than the cost of basics.

With more than 30 new ALICE variables, this Dashboard spotlights needs and pairs them with promising practices – paving the way for targeted solutions for these households.
